Part. B Information Clause on Personal Data Processing

§1 Data Controller

§2 Categories of Personal Data Processed

Registration and professional data: name, professional title, organisation/institution, email address, telephone number, and country/jurisdiction.

Billing data (where provided): company name, address, VAT identification number, and purchase order number.

Image and likeness: photographs and video recordings made during the event (see §3(d) below).

§3 Purposes and Legal Bases of Processing

(a) Administration of conference registration, attendance confirmation, and invoicing (performance of a contract or pre-contractual steps at the data subject's request).

(b) Compliance with legal obligations, including accounting and tax record-keeping.

(c) Communication of event-related information and, where applicable, notification of future editions of the conference (legitimate interest of the Controller in maintaining professional contact with participants). Participants may object to such processing at any time pursuant to Art. 21 GDPR.

(d) Photography and video recording for event documentation and publication on the Controller's website and social media channels. GDPR (consent expressed through registration under the terms set out in Part A, Notice A.1 above). Participants who do not wish to be photographed or filmed may withdraw consent by notifying the organising team at the registration desk upon arrival.

§4 Retention Period

Personal data will be retained for the period necessary to fulfil the purposes described above, and thereafter for the period required by applicable mandatory law — in particular, up to 5 years for accounting records under Polish accounting law (ustawa o rachunkowości), or such longer period as may be required under other applicable law.

§5 Recipients and International Transfers

Personal data may be disclosed to: (i) service providers engaged for event logistics (venue, invoicing, and IT systems) acting as processors under data processing agreements pursuant to Art. 28 GDPR; and (ii) public authorities where required by law. Personal data will not be transferred outside the European Economic Area unless appropriate safeguards are in place pursuant to Chapter V GDPR.

§6 Data Subjects' Rights

Subject to the conditions set out in the GDPR, you have the right to: access your personal data (Art. 15); rectification (Art. 16); erasure (Art. 17); restriction of processing (Art. 18); data portability (Art. 20); object to processing based on legitimate interests (Art. 21); and withdraw consent at any time where processing is based on consent, without affecting the lawfulness of processing carried out prior to withdrawal (Art. 7(3)).
